What is EVIDENCE-BASED EVALUATION?

Evidence-based evaluation (EBE) refers to a process of planning and implementing evaluations which integrates available external evidence, professional expertise and stakeholder values, preferences and circumstances. **External evidence**

What is EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE?

Evidence-based practice refers to a decision-making process which integrates:

- 1) available external evidence,
- 2) professional expertise and
- 3) client values, preferences and circumstances.





What are KEY CHALLENGES to the IMPLEMENTATION OF EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE?

Key challenges to the implementation of evidence-based practice (EBP) include:

- 1) the often-low quality and relevance of existing evidence,
- 2) the poor dissemination and formatting of evidence,
- 3) a lack of EBP trainings and education and
- 4) a non-conducive workplace and political environment.
