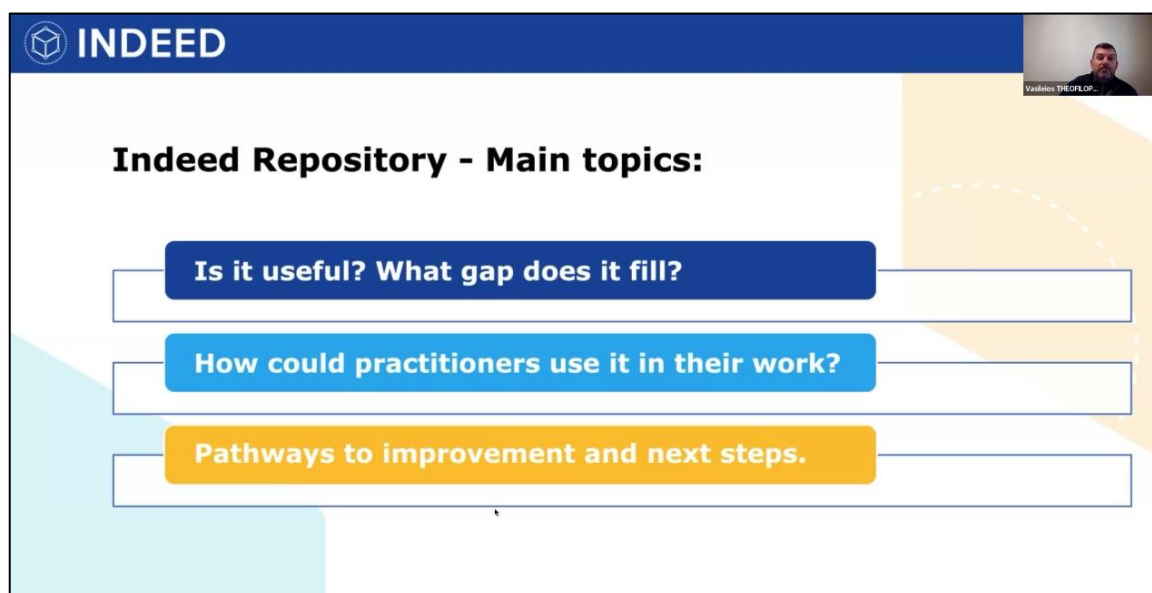

Strengthening Evidence-Based Practice by using the INDEED Repository of Studies on Risk and Protective Factors

The INDEED Webinar "Strengthening Evidence-Based Practice by using the INDEED Repository of Studies on Risk and Protective Factors" was organized on **12 April 2024**. The primary aim of the webinar was to present the INDEED repository to a wide range of stakeholders in the field of P/CVE, and to collect feedback and suggestions for improving the repository further.

The webinar was organized on zoom as the **opening event of the INDEED webinar series** (WP5). The event was moderated by Kai Brand Jacobsen from the Romanian Peace Institute (PATRIR). The webinar opened with a presentation by Stephan Klose (VUB) which introduced the key objectives and functions of the repository. In the second part of the event, a **panel discussion explored the repository's usefulness** for different groups and activities in P/CVE. The panel discussion included presentations by Marzena Kordaczuk-Was (PPHS), Teresa Silva (Midsweden University) and Vasileios Theofilopoulos (Hellenic Police) who built on their own practical experience in the field of P/CVE to explore how the repository can be used to strengthen evidence-based approaches, to initiative design, evaluation and policing. The final part of the webinar took the form of a Q&A in which **audience members had the opportunity to ask questions and share their feedback** on the repository.

The webinar was **attended by more than 100 people**, representing different stakeholders in P/CVE, including many front-line practitioners.
